

## **Nadhr ibn Harith, Cousin of the Prophet (sallallahu alayhi wa sallam)**

### **Great Deceiver and Distracter**

Nadhr ibn Harith was very close to the Prophet (sallallahu alayhi wa sallam). In fact, he was the Prophet's cousin so he knew the Prophet very, very well. He tried to instigate the people against the Prophet (sallallahu alayhi wa sallam) through misinforming them and misleading them.

He knew that he could not say anything bad about him so he used the Prophet's good qualities to scare the Quraysh.
